#### Meal Programs

Chartwells will be running our cafeteria for lunch again this year. Lunch meals cost \$7, or the value meal option is \$5 or \$6. Service will be in place to start on September 9<sup>th</sup>. Parents are asked to download the free <u>Nutrislice app or visit</u> <u>Chartwellsk12.ca</u>. Meals must be pre-paid and pre-ordered. You can choose to pre-pay weekly, monthly, or even daily before 8 am. All meals are healthy balanced meal choices and there are two options daily that vary throughout the year. You can cancel meals in advance from your order history. We are always looking for volunteers to help in the cafeteria. Please let us know if you are interested. <u>Please</u> <u>note that cash will not be accepted this year.</u>

#### **Volunteers**

We appreciate support from our volunteers. Volunteers must have an up-to-date criminal record check and Policy 701 form on file with us. There is also a package of information at the office that needs to be read and signed off on. Our Helping Hands form went home on the first day of school for you to look over and decide on how you might help. Teachers also may reach out to be a chaperone on a bus trip. #### **PSSC**

The Parent School Support Committee is an elected group of parents, a teacher and the principal who meet every other month to discuss school policies and school improvement. #### No Child Without.

If your child has a severe allergy or medical condition, Policy 704 states that they should be wearing a medical alert bracelet. The *No Child Without* program offers a free Medic Alert membership to students who attend school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday. The Medic Alert membership.

- Gives emergency first responders immediate access to your child's medical information on their Medic Alert bracelet.
- Enables first responders to quickly obtain up to date medical information by means of the child's Electronic Health Record through the 24-Hour Emergency Hotline.
- Communicates with the parent or emergency contact upon activation of the Hotline.
- Allows free updates of the child's medical record as needed.

Medic Alert identification alerts school staff, friends, coaches, and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur. To get your medic alert bracelet visit <u>www.nochildwithout.ca</u>.

#### Truth and Reconciliation Day /Orange Shirt Day

On September 27<sup>th</sup> NES will be recognizing Truth and Reconciliation Day at school, a day we encourage all students and staff to wear an orange shirt as we take time to have ageappropriate, meaningful conversation about the effects of Residential Schools. All Canadians can work together to create bridges with each other for reconciliation and reaffirm that all affected truly matter. Every Child Matters, then and now. We encourage you to join us as we commemorate residential school survivors and remember the children who did not survive. Students may wear any orange shirt on this day in support. There will be no school on September 30<sup>th</sup> to recognize this.

#### Lice

A reminder that lice can be passed on person to person. We ask that you check your child at home and let the school know if anything is found. Please educate your child by telling them that lice are very contagious and spread through head-tohead contact and sharing of personal items such as combs and hats. We can all work together to minimize cases at our school. Our policy is to contact home if nits or lice are found so that a parent can pick up their child and treat them. Children treated who have nits or lice can return the next day and we will check them again upon arrival.

#### School Cash Online

Our school is ready to roll to use School Cash Online for the new year. You can pay for school fees, field trips, fundraisers, yearbooks, and school packs this way throughout the year. It is safe, quick, and easy. This increases efficiency and security by allowing you to make payments directly into our school account by credit card or debit. #### Leader of the Day

We will select a Leader of the Day and post their picture on our display in the main lobby. Students will be selected by staff members in recognition of mindful leadership in academics, extra-curricular or outstanding behavior. A letter will be sent home with students selected.

#### **Busses**

Students are allowed two drop off locations unless parents live apart. This should be indicated on the student information form that went home. Students will not be permitted to be dropped off at a friend's home for sleep overs etc. Bus notes are required if a child is going to their alternate stop, and we need to know schedules for children going to two different permanent stops. If your child does not return home on time as planned, please call the school. Please allow 15 minutes after expected arrival time in the afternoons before calling the school looking for students who have not yet arrived – this allows for time delays such as: spare drivers new to a route, breakdowns that may occur on the road to get communicated, delays because of the driver dealing with behavior issues, students dawdling on the way home from the stop, etc. If a student is more than 15 minutes late getting home, then please call. And as always, we ask that parents be visible at afternoon bus stops. Drivers will not let students out if they do not see an adult at the home and they will be returned to the school for the parent to pick up. Also, students have been made aware of bus expectations as well as consequences for student misbehavior on school buses. Drivers will contact the parent regarding misbehavior and a bus suspension can be issued for serious offences. Please review bus rules with your child so their ride will run smoothly. A permission form has gone home to all walkers to be filled out so we have up to date information on who will be picking your child up at dismissal or in grades 3-5 if they will be walking home on their own.

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#### School Picture Day

The school uses these photos for identification purposes on cumulative records and rolodex cards. Please be advised that the photographer is obligated to sign an agreement stating that pictures taken at the school will not be used for any other purpose than those stated above. A permission slip has also been sent home for staff or volunteer designates to take photos for our school yearbook, newsletters, and school promotion items for newspapers or slideshows. We will ask for your signature of approval before proceeding. Retakes will be available if pictures do not turn out the way you would like.
